### **Law Enforcement and First Responder Day**



### **Student Robot Connection**

At Plainedge, Earth Day isn't just about learning — it's about *experiencing* the power of innovation and the importance of protecting our planet. This year, our students participated in an exciting, hands-on Earth Day event featuring six engaging stations, each connecting robotics, creativity, and environmental awareness.

The day kicked off with "Strike Out Pollution with Dash," where students programmed Dash robots to knock down pollution-themed pins. It was a fun, interactive way to show how technology can be used to "clean up" our world, one target at a time.

Next, students got a chance to bring their Earth Day ideas to life using the 3D Doodler pens. At this station, creativity took center stage as they designed Earth-inspired projects, learning that art, too, can send powerful messages about protecting the planet.

In "Dash in Our World," students guided Dash robots through a custom-designed course that simulated real-world environmental challenges. They had to think critically and code carefully to help Dash navigate and complete Earth-saving missions.

From global to local — our fourth station, "Ozobot Across Long Island," brought things closer to home. Students used Ozobot robots to travel across a map of Long

Finally, we took things *out of this world* with a special showing of "Always Above" at the Plainedge Planetarium — a visually stunning space science experience produced by the United States Space Force. It reminded us how small our planet is in the grand scale of the universe, and how important it is to take care of our only home.

Our Earth Day celebration was a perfect blend of robotics, science, creativity, and environmental responsibility. Through these six immersive stations, students didn't just learn about Earth — they became part of its future.
